Dec. 30 - Christmas & New Year celebration and outreach in Khilek Luang, Allen and Mareewan Radtke’s village and location of the weekly Sunday afternoon *House of Grace* meetings. They will invite the community.



PACK-N-GO~Padayhags and Pastor Cura’s family travel to Eastern and Western Cape Provinces the last week of December for survey and ministry opportunities. They return to Boksburg the 2nd week of January for the Bible School opening, followed by a 2-week trip to Kwa-zulu Natal Province for a series of Bible studies and conferences. Pray for safety, health, financial supply and God to prepare hearts for salvation and edification. Padayhags fly to Philippines, Jan. 31. Since February, the first Bible study grew to three, plus regular worship services on Sundays. This church is already saving money to buy a tent so they can meet in a public place. have ever seen. Pr. Vusi Maguma, pastor-in-training, (far left) invited two preachers from other groups to speak just so they could have an opportunity to listen. Pray these leaders will meditate on what they heard—it's sad to see pastors with such a shallow understanding of God's Word. Our vision for next year's

Paul also requests prayer for the up-coming *Pastor Appreciation Sunday* involving both church plants: "We do a lot of mentoring and teaching, and our hope is not only that they'll learn the Scriptures, but also that they'll live it and teach it, passing on the baton to the next generation of South Africans. It's nice to be honored formally, but what matters is that I decrease and Christ increases (Jn.3:30): if my students refuse to follow the Lord faithfully, the honor is empty, and the event is meaningless. Please pray with me that these people will embrace God's message to the max!"



KENYA~needs peace and political stability following recent elections. The incumbent has been sworn in but the opposition refuses to accept his presidency. These tensions prompted TCM-Kenya to postpone their National Conference from this December to August 2018. Evangelistic programs are planned during the Christmas season. Pray lost souls will be drawn to the Lord through the gospel.



PROJECT ABBA~TCM-North Brazil takes the message of Jesus Christ, a van full of presents, a loving group of volunteers, lots of fun, and a delicious snack to different communities, to shower children with the love of God. The rest of the year they minister to the children and their families through local Grace churches.

DUBAI~What does a holiday outreach look like for TCM's Grace Fellowship in Dubai? A weekend camp-out at Al Qudra Lake, a 25-acre, man-made lake in the middle of Saih Al Salam Desert. The lake is home to more than 100 species of birds including many migratory birds. Weekend activities include: worship service, devotional meditation, bird watching, camping, lake viewing, lots of resting and sleeping.
