Common Sayings from the Bible

"The Lord Gives and the Lord Takes Away"

We usually hear people say this in reference to someone who was in a place of prominence and then lost it all. It can refer to a person's wealth, social standing, political office, prestige among their peers, a position of power over others, or any other thing that the world holds to be of value. Most of those who use this saying do so in regards to someone else's misfortune and not their own.

The saying comes from Job's response after receiving the grim news that not only had all of his material wealth been lost, but that all ten of his children had been killed (see Job 1:1-19). "Then Job arose and rent his mantle, and shaved his head, and fell down upon the ground and worshipped, and said, 'Naked came I out of my mother's womb, and naked shall I return thither: The Lord gave and the Lord hath taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord.' In all this Job sinned not, nor charged God foolishly" (Job 1:20-22). In his own time of great calamity, Job was acknowledging the sovereignty of God in every aspect of his life. He gave God the credit for all the blessings of good that he had enjoyed in life and knew that if God allowed them to be taken away, He had a purpose in it and deserved to be trusted and worshipped. "For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out" (I Tim. 6:7). The Bible teaches us that it is more important to trust in the Eternal God and worship Him rather than in the passing things of the world.
